#### **DALJIT DHALIWAL**

##### *Anchor*

Daljit Dhaliwal is the anchor of *WIDE ANGLE*, PBS's acclaimed international TV documentary series. Over the years she has worked for some of the world's most respected news organizations, including the BBC and CNN International, where she covered the Iraq war and insurgency, the aftermath of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, the war in Afghanistan, the Balkans conflict, the Middle East conflict and the Rwanda genocide, among other stories.

During her career as a studio news anchor, she has interviewed many newsmakers and figures, including the late Yasser Arafat, northern Ireland's Gerry Adams, former US Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, Israel's Shimon Peres and Ehud Olmert, Mexico's Vicente Fox, Russia's Sergey Lavrov, Liberia's Charles Taylor, Britain's Jack Straw, R. James Woolsey, the former head of the CIA, and Amr Moussa, the secretary-general of the Arab League.

In addition to anchoring *WIDE ANGLE*, she is an occasional guest host on the PBS interview program, *Charlie Rose*, and the public radio programs *On the Media*, *The Brian Lehrer Show* and *The Leonard Lopate Show*.

She has moderated several conferences for the United Nations in New York and the Hague on child combatants, press freedom and women's issues, and has served as a member of the Indo-British roundtable at the invitation of the British government.

Dhaliwal holds a bachelor's degree from the University of East London, a master's degree from the University of London, and an honorary doctorate from the University of East London.

#### **STEPHEN SEGALLER**

##### *Executive Producer*

Stephen Segaller is the director of news and public affairs programming at Thirteen/WNET, the flagship station of the Public Broadcasting Service and one of America's most prominent producers of noncommercial news and documentary programming. At Thirteen/WNET, Segaller supervises *Religion & Ethics NewsWeekly*, *Roadtrip Nation*, and *NOW*, documentary series such as *Extreme Oil*, *Red Gold*, *Local News*, and the Fred Friendly Seminars, as well as documentary specials, including the films of Frederick Wiseman, the award-winning *Srebrenica: A Cry from the Grave*, *Kofi Annan: Center of the Storm*, and the Academy award-nominated *Sound and Fury*. In 2002, he created the award-winning primetime international documentary series *Wide Angle*, which is now entering its sixth season of production. In 2006, he launched *Exposé: America's*



*Investigative Reports*, a continuing series that chronicles groundbreaking journalistic investigations by featuring the committed reporters and editors who have produced them. A journalist since 1975, Mr. Segaller has also written three books: *Invisible Armies: Terrorism Into the 1990s*; *Wisdom of the Dream: The World of C.G. Jung*; and *Nerds 2.0.1, A Brief History of the Internet*, the companion volume to the PBS series of the same name, which Segaller produced.

**PAMELA HOGAN**

***Series Producer***

Pamela Hogan has been Series Producer for **WIDE ANGLE** since its launch in 2002, and has originated two of the series' films: Emmy-winner *Ladies First*, about the leadership role of Rwanda's women 10 years after the genocide, and *Time for School*, a 12-year project spotlighting the global education crisis through the stories of seven children in seven countries striving to beat the odds against staying in school. Hogan previously produced *Bill Moyers Reports: Earth On Edge*, a two-hour environmental special for public television. As an independent producer, with Harvard professor Peter Galison she co-produced and directed *Ultimate Weapon: The H-Bomb Dilemma*, which aired on the History Channel and is used in university courses around the world, and films on wide-ranging subjects for PBS, NBC, and Turner Broadcasting. After the fall of the Khmer Rouge, she was field producer for the Peabody Award-winning *To Be An American* (NBC), a 1989 documentary with Tom Brokaw about a Cambodian refugee family's first year in America. At National Geographic Television, she oversaw all domestic and international co-productions worldwide, producing award-winning programming both for the PBS National Geographic Specials and the TBS Explorer series. Hogan also spearheaded the expansion of Reader's Digest TV & Video into new markets, executive producing and supervising dozens of productions. A member of the Directors Guild of America, she holds a B.A. from Harvard College and an M.S. from the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism.

**ANDY HALPER**

***Senior Producer***

Andy Halper serves as senior producer for news and public affairs at Thirteen/WNET, developing programming for the PBS national schedule. He distinguished himself as the producer of the *Moyers in Conversation* programs that were broadcast in the aftermath of the World Trade Center disaster. He was also supervising producer for the PBS series *That Money Show*. Prior to joining Thirteen, Halper produced several programs for the *Fred Friendly Seminars* broadcast series, including *Whose Law? Whose Order?*; *Epidemic!*; and *Privacy and Security on the Eve of the Millennium*. Previous PBS projects include *Trial by Television*, *On the Issues* (with John Chancellor), and *Voices of the Electorate*. Mr. Halper has received a News and Documentary Emmy for **WIDE ANGLE**, the Edward R. Murrow Award from the RTNDA for Best News Documentary, two Silver Hugo Awards from the Chicago International Television Festival, two New York Emmys, an Overseas Press Club Award, and a bevy of Cine Golden Eagles.
